Please note: If your child does not have access to internet or a computer/device, here are some options we recommend.

1. Spend time reading independently- write down story elements (characters, setting, problem solution)
2. Respond to reading by writing a summary, writing predictions for future chapters, writing down questions that you wonder as you are reading, and write down tricky or new words and try to use the text to decide what that word means.
3. Free write! Write a narrative story with a character, problem, and solution.

4. Writing option- A third grade writing unit consists of fairy tales. Can you choose a current fairytale, and create your own version of it? I would love to see!
5. Practice multiplication facts – play against family member!
6. Create your own story problems to solve (adding, subtracting, multiplying, or dividing)
7. Get fresh air outside in your yard
8. Be creative and try a drawing/ coloring/ painting/ or even building with legos activity
9. Most importantly, rest up and stay healthy!

For students with access to internet and a computer!

1. 30 minutes of iReady reading day
2. 30 minutes of iReady math each day
3. 20 minutes of Spelling City activities
4. 15-20 minutes practice of multiplication facts
5. 30 minutes independent reading
